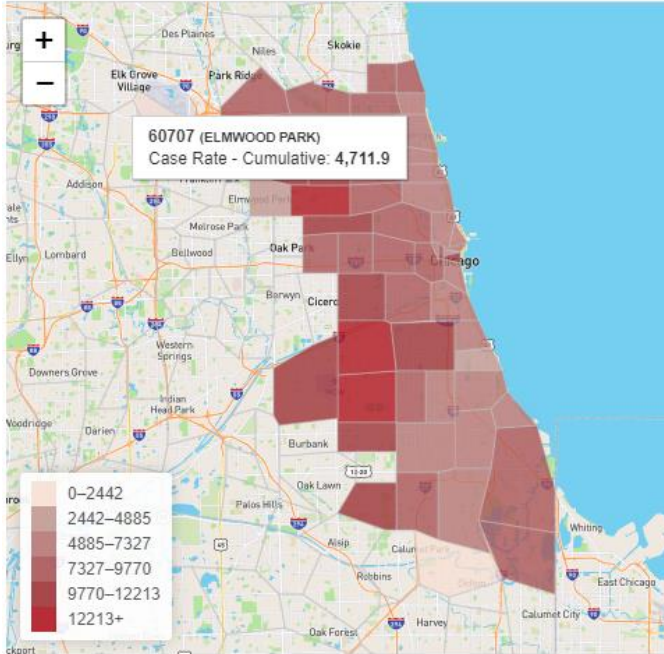

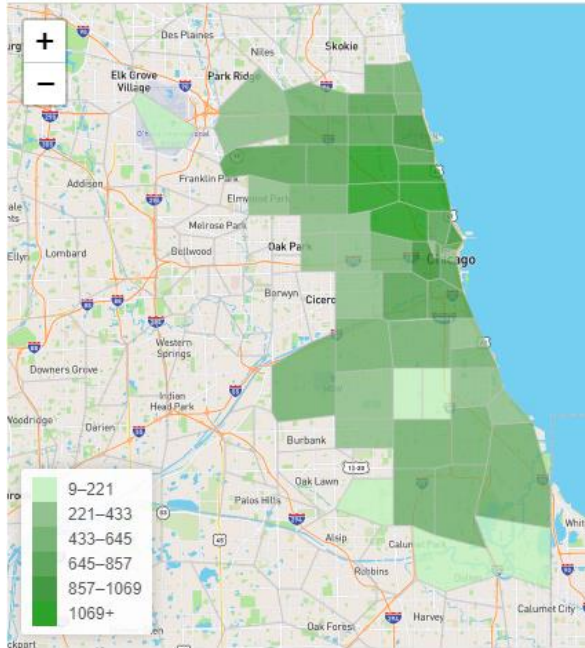
Case Rate per 100k Population

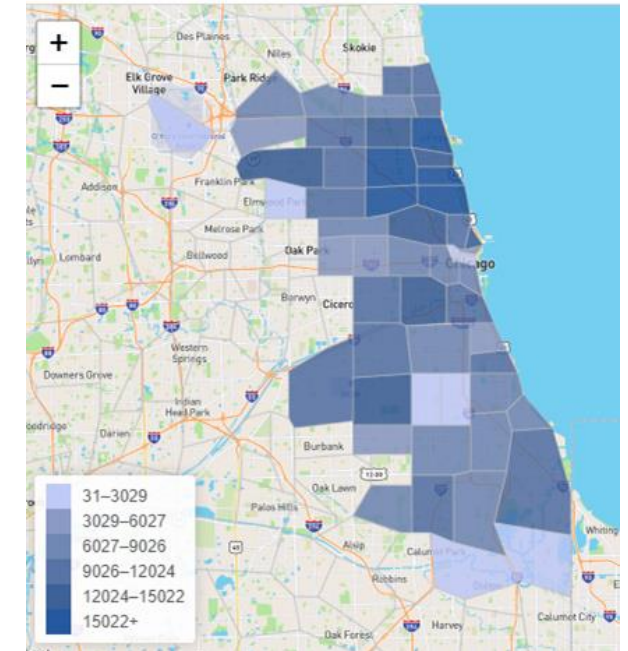
Number of Loans

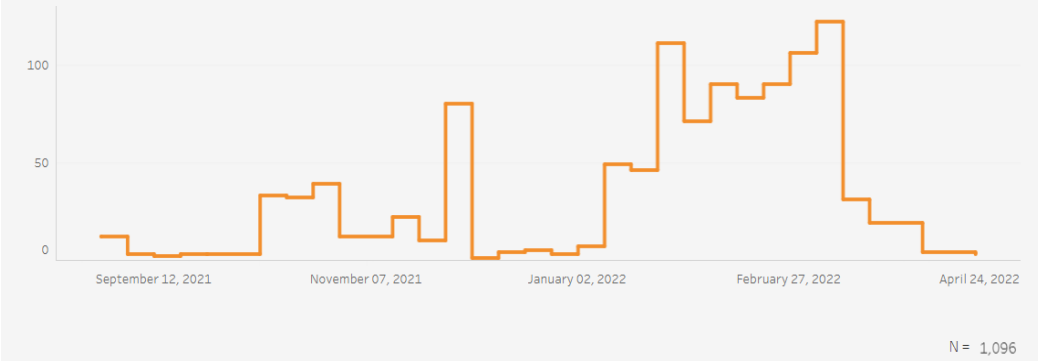

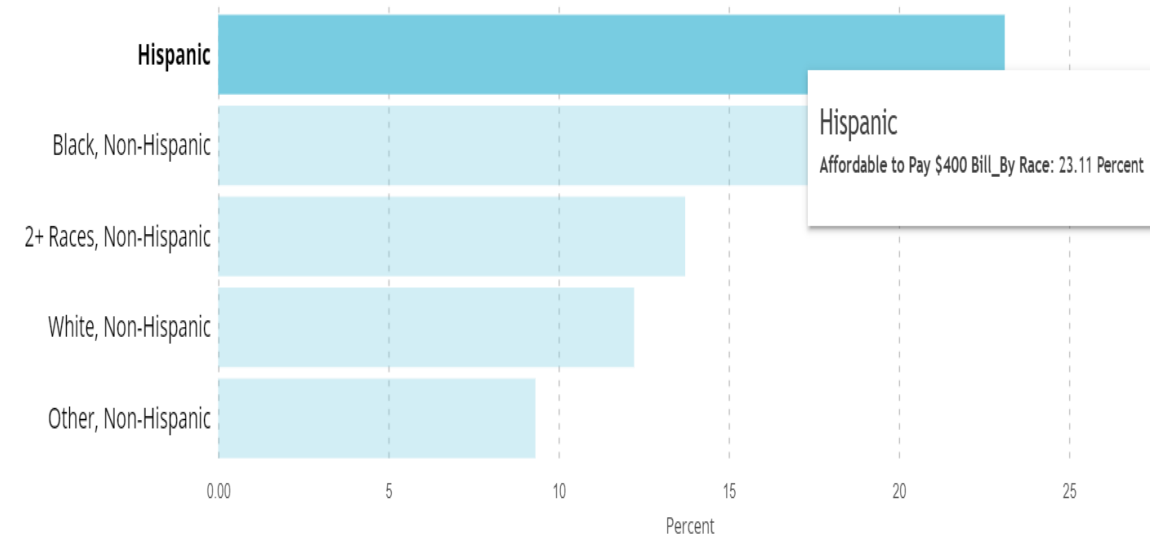

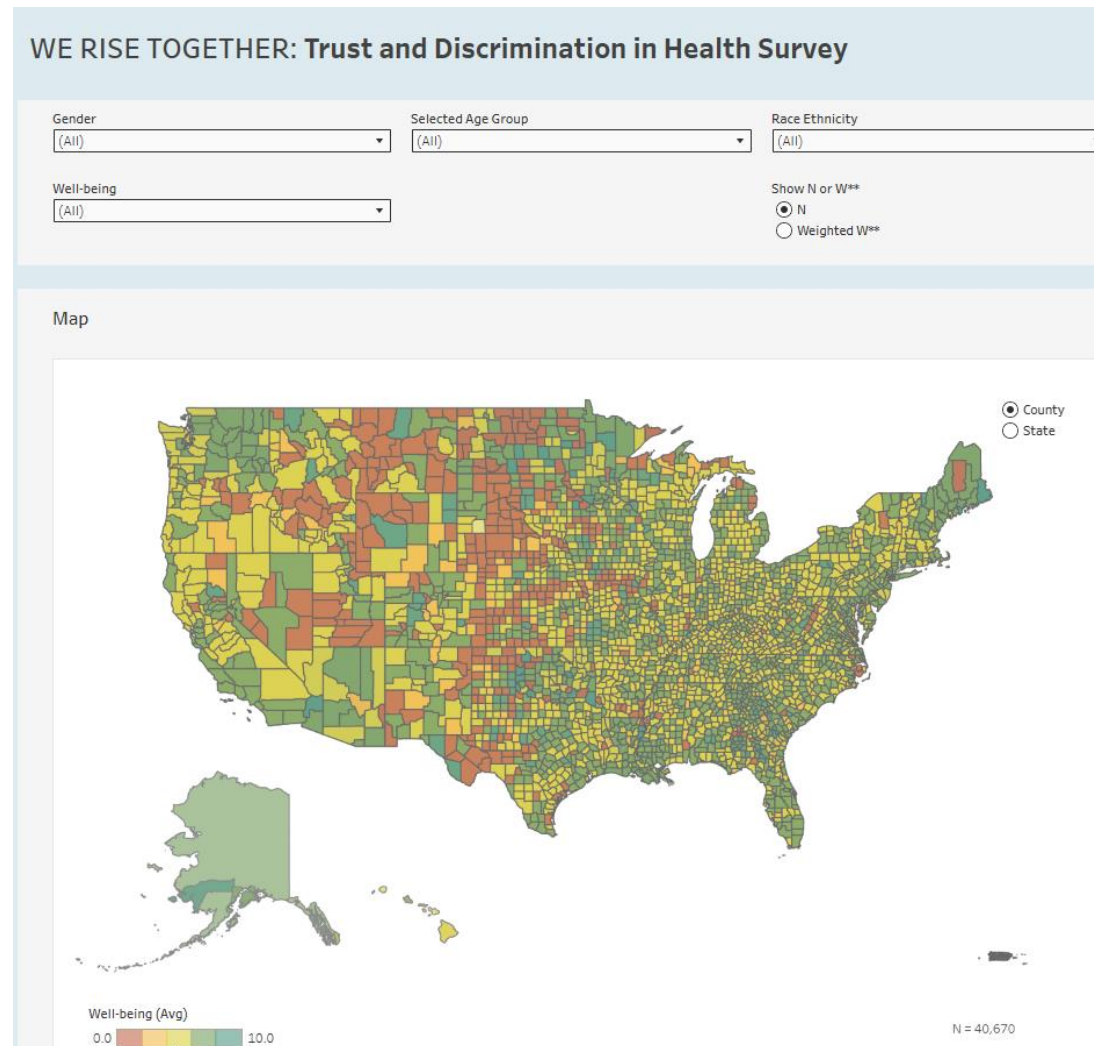
Inability to Afford a \$400 Emergency Expense, by Race/Ethnicity (2017)

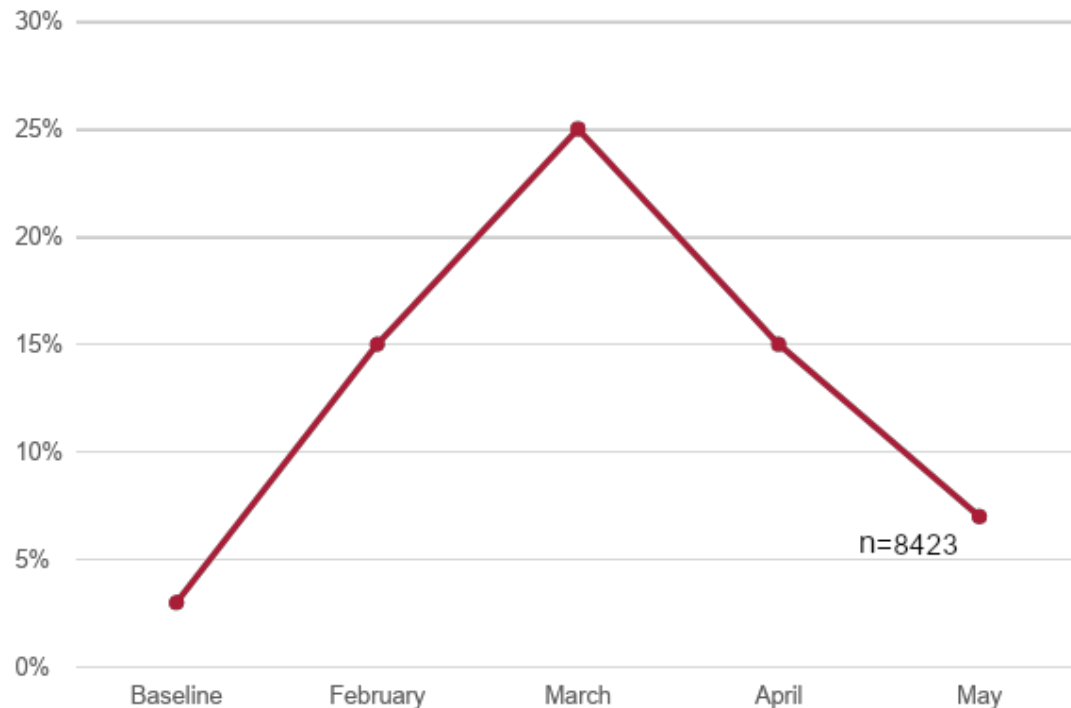

% DSAMH Patients who are Suffering

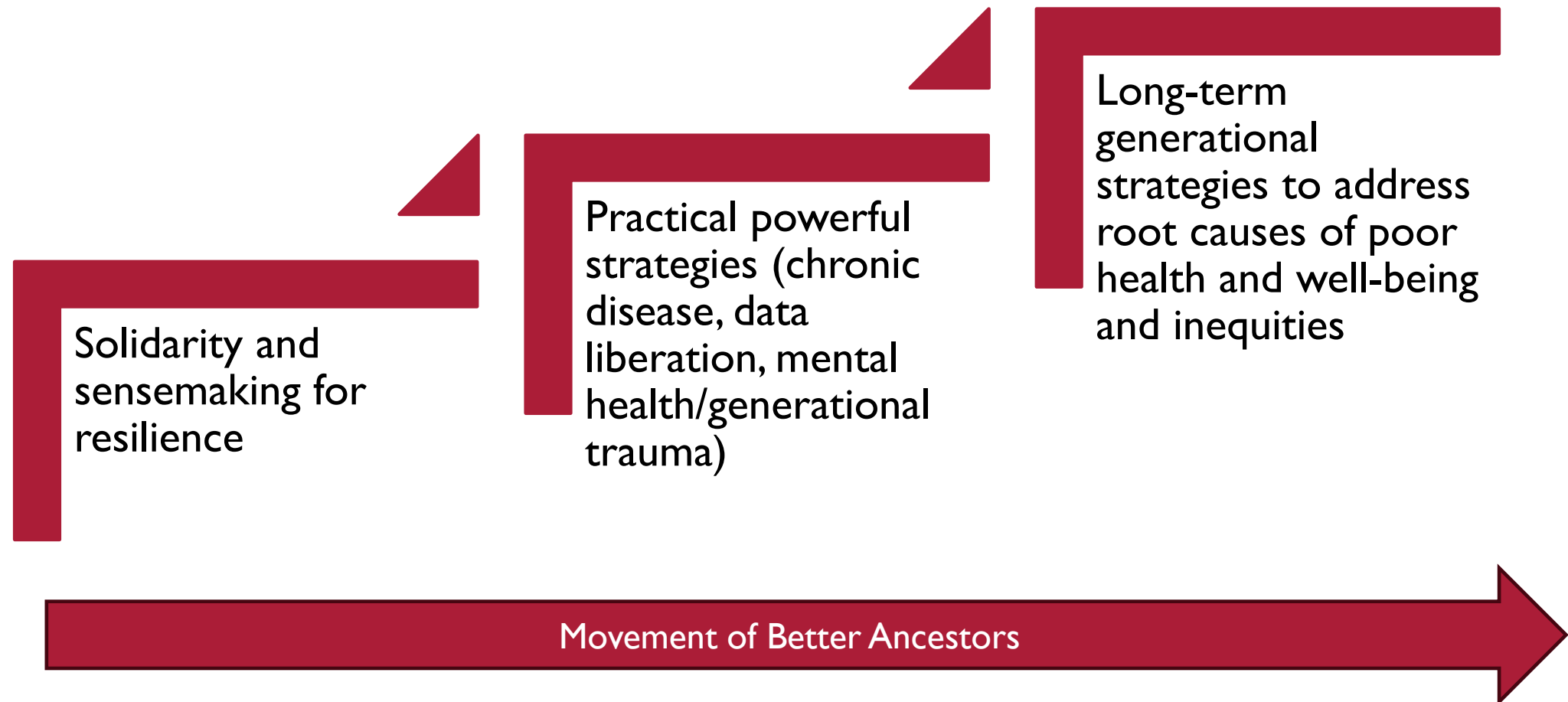


- One of only three states where overdose rates didn't increase in 2020 (23% increase on average across nation)

WHAT THE WIN DATA COOPERATIVE WILL DO

1. **Build shared stewardship for an equitable data infrastructure that can be grounded in the wisdom of communities and partners whose work is to build and safeguard the data commons.**
2. **Elevate frameworks, approaches and tools that advance a data democracy, starting with WIN Measures reorganization.**
3. **Leverage our real-time data pipeline to build infrastructure, tools, and research necessary for truth-telling, strategy and transformation across sectors.**
4. **Develop data pipelines for organizations and communities** that are in data deserts or need data infrastructure to power their efforts and collect our own data for resilience and renewal.
5. **Accelerate better change across communities through data storytelling and policy integration.** Through quarterly cooperative meetings, data digests and reports, we will illuminate both threats to well-being, multisolvers for well-being and policy opportunities to advance well-being.
6. **Power a new generation of data activists** – Power 10,000 well-being and equity data activists– communities, researchers, policymakers, reporters, system changers, and well-being and equity architects who use the data to create meaningful change to advance well-being and equity.

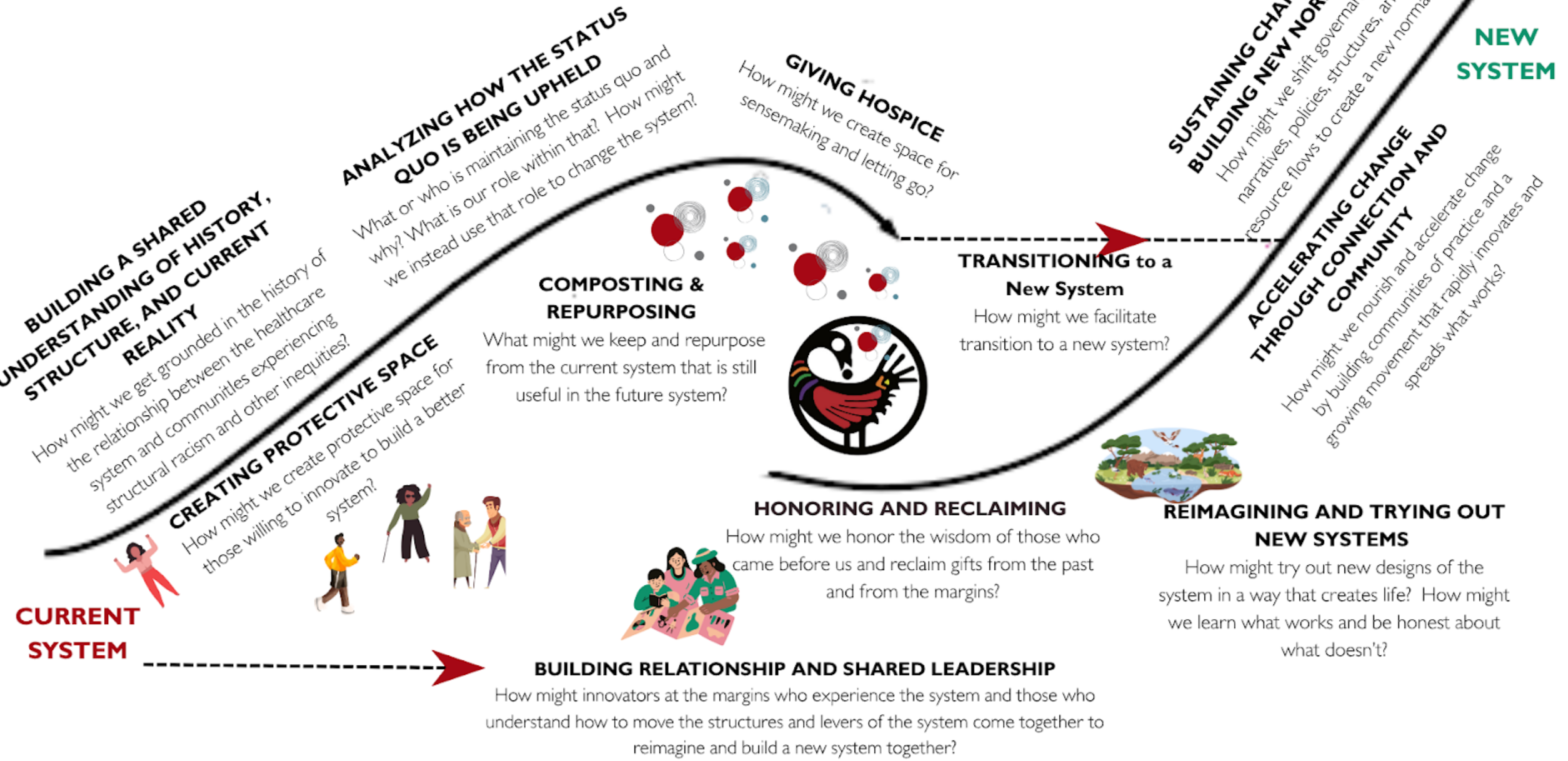
- Giving people food →

Care - Divest from toxic debt collection practices that create barriers to care (do no harm)

- Take down signage about patients being responsible for their bills,
- Do not send bills to the poorest zip codes in your area (make that part of a sliding scale)
- Remove RevUp and other predatory algorithms from your revenue cycle processes

02

Civic Life - Advocate for policies that secure mission over margin

- Advocate for an uncompensated care pool so that everyone—not just safety net sites—can share in care of the uninsured
- Advocate for oversight over private equity investment in nonprofit healthcare
- Advocate with communities for strategic policy priorities, (eg affordable, universal, community-grounded healthcare)

Community - Relationship and restorative investment in communities

- Align community benefit and anchor strategies to community priorities
- Drive community benefit and anchor strategies to balance charity care with upstream investment in wealthbuilding in communities
