



## A tremendous need...

## 1 in 5 adults in America experiences a mental illness

Depression is the **leading cause** of disability worldwide.

About **10.2 million adults** have co-occurring mental health and addiction disorders.

**26%** of homeless adults live with serious mental illness.

**60%** of adults with mental illness did not receive mental services in the past year.





22 veterans commit suicide each day.

90% of those who die by suicide have an **underlying mental illness**.

50% of all chronic mental illness begins by the **age of 14.** 

57% of adults without mental illness symptoms believe people are caring and sympathetic to it. Only 25% of adults with mental illness agree.



## Complex, nation-wide challenges...

## **Community voices:**

The most critical mental health concerns identified by recent data collection activity include the following:

- Access challenges
- Stigma
- Mental and physical care lack integration
- Inadequate children's services and community partnerships
- The need for new treatments and prevention strategies


Increasing Caregiver Needs
